Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

FISCAL NOTE

This bill increases the penalty for certain violations of law from traffic infractions to Class E crimes and establishes a new Class E crime. If a jail sentence is imposed for Class E crimes, the additional costs to the counties are estimated to be \$82.48 per day per prisoner. These costs are not reimbursed by the State. The number of prosecutions that may result in a jail sentence and the resulting costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

This bill may increase the number of criminal and traffic infraction cases filed in the court system. The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

SUMMARY

The amendment removes several sections of the bill that have been addressed by other bills during this session and removes a section that proposed to make selling or equipping a vehicle with certain after market items a Class E crime. The amendment also repeals obsolete language pertaining to the Joint Standing Committee on Transportation's review of rules adopted by the Chief of the State Police and enacts the standard language required to ensure legislative review of major substantive rules under the Administrative Procedures Act.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
