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20	COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 319, L.D. 953, Bill, "An Act to Reclassify Certain Waters of the State"
22	Amend the bill in section 5 by striking out all of paragraph
24	B (page 2, lines 20 to 43 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:
26	' <u>B. Carrabassett River Drainage.</u>
28	(1) Carrabassett River, main stem.
30	(a) Above a point located 1.0 mile above the dam
32	<u>in Kingfield - Class AA.</u>
34	(b) From a point located 1.0 mile above the dam in Kingfield to a point located 1.0 mile above the
36	railroad bridge in North Anson - Class A.
38	(c) From a point located 1.0 mile above the railroad bridge in North Anson to its confluence
	with the Kennebec River - Class B.
40	<u>(2) Carrabassett River, tributaries - Class A unless</u>

46	The Legislature finds, however, that permitted water withdrawal from this river segment provides
48	significant social and economic benefits and that this existing use may be maintained.

Machias River, tributaries - Class A unless otherwise 16 specified. 18 All tributaries entering below (1)Route 1A in Whitneyville - Class B. 20 (2) Mopang Stream, from the outlet of Mopang Second 22 Lake to its confluence with the Machias River - Class AA. 24 (3) Old Stream, from the outlet of First Lake to its 26 confluence with the Machias River - Class AA. 28 (4) West Branch of the Machias River, from the outlet of Lower Sabao Lake to its confluence with the Machias 30 River - Class AA. 32 (5) New Stream, in Northfield and Wesley - Class AA. 34 (6) Crooked Stream - Class AA.' 36 Further amend the bill in section 7 in paragraph B by inserting at the end the following: 38 '(6) Shorey Brook - Class AA.' 40 Further amend the bill in section 10 in paragraph F in 42 subparagraph (14) in the first line (page 8, line 11 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "Class AA" and inserting in its 44 place the following: 'Class A' 46 Further amend the bill in section 14 in paragraph B in subparagraph (3) in the first line (page 9, line 22 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "Class AA" and inserting in its 48 place the following: 'Class A' 50

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Further amend the bill by inserting after section 15 the 2 following: 'Sec. 16. 38 MRSA §467, sub-§14, ¶A, as repealed and replaced 4 by PL 1989, c. 764, §15, is repealed and the following enacted in its place: б 8 A. St. George River, main stem. 10 (1) From the outlet of Little Pond to a point located 2,000 feet below the pond - Class A. 12 (2) From a point located 2,000 feet below the outlet 14 of Little Pond to the confluence with Stevens Pond, from the outlet of Stevens Pond to the confluence with 16 Trues Pond and from the outlet of Trues Pond to the confluence with Sennebec Pond - Class AA. 18 (3) From the outlet of Sennebec Pond to Route 90, 20 excluding segments that are great ponds - Class A. 22 (4) From Route 90 to tidewater - Class B.' 24 Further amend the bill by inserting after section 18 the following: 26 'Sec. 19. 38 MRSA §467, sub-§16, ¶A, as amended by PL 1991, c. 813, Pt. E, §5, is further amended to read: 28 30 A. Salmon Falls River, main stem. 32 (1) From the outlet of Great East Lake to tidewater, these--waters--lying--within-the--State---including--all 34 impoundments the Route 9 bridge - Class B. 36 (2) From the Route 9 bridge to tidewater - Class C.' 38 Further amend the bill in section 25 by striking out all paragraph D (page 12, lines 28 to 47 in L.D.) and inserting in 40 its place the following: 42 'D. Mount Desert. 44 Tidal waters, except those lying within 500 feet (1) of privately owned shoreline, lying northerly of 46 latitude 44' - 16'-36" N. and easterly of longitude 68' - 13'-08" W. - Class SA. 48 Tidal waters of Somes Sound lying northerly of a (2) 50 line beginning at a point located at the Acadia National Park boundary at latitude 44' - 18'-18" N., 52 longitude 68' - 18'-42" N W. and running northeasterly

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to a point located at the Acadia National Park boundary 2 at latitude 44' - 18'-54" N., longitude 68' - 18'-22" W. and-lying-southerly-of-a-line-beginning-at-a-point leeated-at-latitude-44'----19'-37"-N.,--longitude-68'----4 18--52"-W, - and - running - northeasterly -to -a -point-located 6 except those waters of Broad Cove lying west of a line running from the point of land immediately south of the 8 cove northerly to Navigation Can #7 and those waters 10 lving within 500 feet of overboard discharges licensed as of January 1, 1999 - Class SA. 12 (3) Tidal waters of Somes Sound lying within 500 feet

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 27 the following:

 Sec. 28. Contingent effective date. The Maine Revised Statutes, Title 38, section 469, subsection 2, paragraph D, subparagraph
(3) takes effect only if the Commissioner of Environmental Protection certifies as part of the relicensing process that
there are practicable alternatives to the 2 existing licensed overboard discharges to those waters described in that section of
statute.

28 Sec. 29. Findings. The Legislature finds that the reclassification of a segment of the St. George River from Class C to Class AA in 1990 was the result of a significant procedural 30 error that occurred during the reclassification process in 1989 32 and 1990. This Act corrects that error, which was unique to a narrow set of circumstances surrounding an application for a 34 permit to reconstruct а dam that was being processed simultaneously with larger reclassification process. the Specifically, the Department of Environmental Protection staff 36 that was processing the permit application did not know about the 38 pending reclassification to Class AA and the department staff that was developing the reclassification study for the Board of 40 Environmental Protection was unaware that an application for a dam reconstruction on that segment of the river had been submitted. The Legislature finds that if the department staff 42 and the Board of Environmental Protection had been aware of the application, they may have made a different reclassification 44 recommendation to the Legislature. The Legislature further finds that the correct classification for the segment of the St. George 46 River that extends from the outlet of Little Pond to 2,000 feet 48 downstream is Class A.'

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Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any 2 nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively. 4 6 SUMMARY 8 This amendment does the following. 10 It reclassifies the South Branch Carrabassett River from Class A to Class AA, but specifies that the existing use of 12 permitted water withdrawal from that river segment provides significant social and economic benefits and may be maintained. 14 It reclassifies Crooked Stream, a tributary of the Machias 16 River, from Class A to Class AA. It reclassifies Shorey Brook, a tributary of the Narraguagus 18 River, from Class A to Class AA. 20 It reclassifies Salmon Stream, a tributary of the Penobscot 2.2 River, from Class B to Class A, rather than Class AA as proposed in the bill. 24 It reclassifies Buff Brook, a tributary of the Saco River, 26 from Class B to Class A, rather than Class AA as proposed in the bill. 28 It classifies 2,000 feet of the St. George River, beginning 30 at the outlet of Little Pond, as Class A. That segment of the river was reclassified from Class C to Class AA in 1990 as a 32 result of a significant procedural error that occurred during the reclassification process in 1989 and 1990. 34 It reclassifies the segment of the Salmon Falls River from 36 the Route 9 bridge to tidewater from Class B to Class C. 38 It makes the reclassification of a small area of Somes Sound from Class SB to Class SA contingent upon the Commissioner of 40 Environmental Protection certifying that there is a practicable alternative to the 2 existing licensed overboard discharges to 42 those waters. 44 It also corrects a technical error in the bill.

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
