22	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting
24	clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the following:

This bill increases the penalty for certain Class C and Class B crimes by one class. Sentences of more than 9 months for Class C, Class B and Class A crimes must be served in state correctional institutions. Since the average length of stay for a Class A crime is three years and 3 months greater than a Class B crime, the incremental increase in the average cost to the State's correctional facilities is \$89,444 when the class of crime is increased from Class B to Class A. For Class C crimes increased to Class B, the average length of stay for a Class B crime is 1 year and 3 months greater than a Class C crime and the incremental increase in the average cost to the State's correctional facilities is \$34,343. Sentences of 9 months or less for Class C, Class B and Class A crimes must be served in county jails. The State provides reimbursement to the counties for housing these offenders.

The Judicial Department may require additional General Fund appropriations to cover increased indigent defense costs related to those cases when the class of crime is increased. The amounts can not be estimated at this time. The collection of additional fines may also increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'

The amendment deletes language that would have amended the definition of aggravated trafficking and furnishing to include whenever serious bodily injury or death results to another person as a result of the furnishing or trafficking. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
