	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §314-A, sub-§5, as amended by PL 1991, c. 426,
4	§5, is further amended to read:
б	5. Restrictions. No license may be transferred or
	assigned. No more than one license may be issued under this
8	section to any federally recognized Indian tribe for any one period. No more than one licensee may operate or conduct a beano
10	game or high-stakes beano game on the same premises on the same date. All games must be conducted within the Indian Territory of
12	the licensed organization, or at a commercial track as defined
	in Title 8, section 275-A that conducted at least 100 live race
14	days during each of the prior 2 calendar years.
