An Act to Reduce the Amount of Paperwork Required for Transactions Involving the Sale of Wood.

wood, -- identifying; the name or names of the person or persons 2 providing the service, the location from which the wood was hauled; for wood harvested in the State, the number on the harvest notification form filed with the Bureau of Forestry in accordance with Title 12, section 8883; and the date the measurements were made. If, based upon a complaint involving wood that is taken outside the State, the state sealer, after 8 investigation, has reason to believe that there has been inaccurate measurement of the wood, that the measurement of the 10 inaccurately or incompletely represented on the wood was measurement tally sheet or that a measurement tally sheet for the wood was not promptly provided to the person providing the 12 service, then, except in a case of inadvertent error, the state 14 sealer shall require, for a period of not less than one year, that the person requiring the service measure and provide the 16 person providing the service a completed measurement tally sheet for wood that is taken outside the State.

Sec. 6. 10 MRSA §2364-C is enacted to read:

\$2364-C. Transportation of wood

- 1. Information required. Upon delivery of a truckload of wood, the truck driver shall provide the wood scaler or other person accepting delivery with the town of origin for the wood and, for wood harvested in the State, the number on the harvest notification form filed with the Bureau of Forestry in accordance with Title 12, section 8883. When a tally sheet or other record of measurement is required under section 2364-A, subsection 2, the harvest notification number must be recorded on the record of measurement.
- 36 2. Enforcement: violations. Upon request, a truck driver shall provide any employee of the State charged with enforcing 38 the provisions of this subchapter with the town of origin for a truckload of wood and, for wood harvested in the State, the 40 number on the harvest notification form filed with the Bureau of Forestry in accordance with Title 12, section 8883. Upon request, a wood scaler shall present the record of measurement 42 including town of origin and, for wood harvested in the State, 44 the number on the harvest notification form to any employee of the State charged with enforcing the provisions of this 46 subchapter. A person who fails to comply with the provisions of this section or misrepresents information is subject to the 48 penalties provided in section 2368.

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SUMMARY

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This bill repeals the provision in the wood measurement laws that requires that a trip ticket accompany each load of wood transported. Instead, the bill requires the harvest notification number to be recorded on the measurement tally sheet. The bill requires the truck driver to provide the wood scaler and persons charged with enforcing the wood measurement laws with the town of origin for a truckload of wood and the harvest notification number for wood harvested in the State.

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
