36	The Bureau of Corporations, Elections and Commissions will incur some minor additional costs related to Madrid's		
38	deorganization referendum. These costs can be absorbed within		

the Office of the Secretary of State's existing budgeted resources.

If the deorganization is approved by the voters of Madrid, the Department of Education, Education in the Unorganized Territory program, will incur additional costs beginning in fiscal year 2000-01 estimated to be \$280,000 annually. Law 1999, chapter 16, the "current services" budget bill, includes sufficient funding in fiscal year 2000-01 for these costs. If the voters of Madrid do not approve deorganization, this amount may be deappropriated.
