- Appointments; meetings. 22 Sec. 3. **Resolved:** That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities must 24 notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council upon 26 making their appointments. When the appointment of all members is complete, the chair of the Legislative Council shall call and 28 convene the first meeting of the commission no later than October 1, 1999. The commission shall select a chair from among its 30 legislative members; and be it further
- 32 Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall assess and evaluate salmonid fish culture facilities in Maine and associated 34 production and distribution capabilities, opportunities and needs, including waste discharge licensing issues. In addition, 36 the commission shall develop recommendations designed to provide for the production and distribution of fish needed to meet future 38 sport fish management program needs in the most cost effective manner; and be it further
- Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission shall request staffing assistance from the Legislative Council; and be it further

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

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This resolve includes additional General Fund appropriations of \$5,175 in fiscal year 1999-00 and \$3,360 in fiscal year 2000-01 for the Legislature for the per diem and expenses of legislative members and the expenses of other eligible members of the Commission to Study the Needs and Opportunities Associated with the Production of Salmonid Sport Fish in Maine and to print the required report.

The additional costs associated with providing staffing 10 assistance to the commission during the interim between legislative sessions can be absorbed by the Legislature utilizing 12 existing budgeted resources. If the commission chooses to meet during the legislative session and requests staffing assistance 14 during that period, the Legislature may require an additional General Fund appropriation to contract for staff services.

The Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife will incur 18 some minor additional costs to participate in the commission. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing 20 budgeted resources.'

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SUMMARY

26 This amendment broadens the duties of the proposed commission to study the needs and opportunities associated with the production of salmonid sport fisheries in Maine. The amendment also changes and expands the commission membership by adding the following members:

32 1. The Superintendent of Fish Culture at the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife; and

 Two members of the Inland Fisheries and Wildlife
 Advisory Council, 3 individuals who represent owners or operators of a private fish hatchery in the State, one member of the
 Sportsman's Alliance of Maine and one individual who owns or operates a private aquaculture facility in the State.

This amendment clarifies and specifies the duties of the 42 commission with regard to salmonid fish culture facilities in Maine.

This amendment also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the bill.
