	'Sec. 1. Rules. Resolved: That, by January 1, 2000, the
32	Department of Human Services shall adopt rules regarding the wearing of identification badges by persons who provide services
34	in health care facilities licensed by the department. In adopting the rules, the Commissioner of Human Services shall
36	consider the goal of increasing information available to consumers of health care services. If the rules require certain
38	employees to wear identification badges in some situations in some facilities, the rules must contain exceptions for situations
40	in which wearing an identification badge would create a safety hazard. Rules adopted pursuant to this resolve are routine
42	technical rules as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.'

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 722, L.D. 1012

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'FISCAL NOTE

The Department of Human Services will incur some minor additional costs to adopt rules. These costs can be absorbed within the Department of Human Services' existing budgeted foresources.'

SUMMARY

This amendment changes the bill to a resolve. It directs 12 the Department of Human Services to adopt rules regarding the wearing of identification badges by persons who provide services 14 in health care facilities licensed by the department. If the rules require certain employees to wear identification badges in 16 some situations in some facilities, the rules must contain exceptions for situations in which wearing an identification 18 badge would create a safety hazard. It adds a fiscal note.

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
