## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §6162-A, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1997, c. 643, Pt. RR, §6, is further amended to read: 4 Income. Eligibility for this program is determined by 2. 6 the same income levels as eligibility for elderly households is determined under chapter 907, except that individuals are also 8 eligible for this program if the household spends at least 40% of on unreimbursed direct medical 10 its income expenses for prescription drugs and the household income is not more than 25% higher than the levels specified in chapter 907. 12 For the purposes of this subsection, the costs of drugs provided to a 14 household under this chapter is considered a cost spent by the household for eligibility determination purposes. Notwithstanding this subsection, an elderly individual is 16 eligible for this program if the individual's sole source of 18 income is from Social Security benefits. 20 SUMMARY 22 This bill makes an elderly individual eligible for the 24 elderly low cost drug program if the individual's sole source of income is Social Security benefits.
