'FISCAL NOTE

8 The Maine Historic Preservation Commission will incur some minor additional costs to issue a report on the protection of 10 Indian archaeological sites. These costs can be absorbed within the commission's existing budgeted resources.'

SUMMARY

16 The amendment eliminates the \$10,000 General Fund appropriation and replaces it with a requirement to report on the 18 protection of Indian archeological sites by the Maine Historic Preservation Commission.
