2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §1760, sub-§80 is enacted to read:**

6 80. Sales occurring on the Passamaquoddy reservation.
8 Sales occurring on the Passamaquoddy reservation at either
10 Pleasant Point or Indian Township, to the extent the sales are
12 subject to a tribally imposed tax that does not exceed the amount
14 of sales tax that would otherwise be due under this chapter.

12 SUMMARY

14 This bill makes sales occurring on the Passamaquoddy
16 reservation exempt from the state sales and use tax to the extent
the sales are subject to a tribally imposed tax and the tax does
not exceed the sales tax that would otherwise be imposed.
