## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §1002, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 693,  $\S$ 5 and 8, is amended to read:

6 2. Employment by school administrative unit, school union, academy. -A- Except as provided in this subsection, a member of a school board or spouse of a member may not be employed as a 8 full-time employee in a public school within the jurisdiction of 10 the school board to which the member is elected or contract high school or academy located within a supervisory union in which the 12 member is a representative on the union committee. The spouse of a school board member may be employed as a substitute teacher or 14 a coach of extracurricular activities and may work as a volunteer in a public school within the jurisdiction of the school board or 16 union committee on which that person's spouse serves. A school board member must be recused during salary or other personnel 18 deliberations directly affecting the spouse of the school board member. 20

**SUMMARY** 

24 This bill amends the conflict of interest law for school board members to permit the spouse of a board member to be employed as a substitute teacher or extracurricular activity coach or to work as a volunteer in a school within the jurisdiction of the school board on which that person's spouse serves.
