	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
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	Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §6206, sub-§4 is enacted to read:
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	4. Income limitations requiring copayments in the elderly
6	low-cost drug program. A claimant representing an elderly
	household gualifies for the elderly low-cost drug program under
8	chapter 905 if the household income exceeds the requirements of
	<u>subsection 1 or 2 as provided in this subsection.</u>
10	
	A. If the household income exceeds the requirements of
12	subsection 1 or 2 by up to 30%, the household is eligible
	for participation and must pay a copayment of 30% of the
14	cost of the medication.
16	B. If the household exceeds the requirements of subsection
10	1 or 2 by between 31% and 40%, the household is eligible for
18	participation and must pay a copayment of 40% of the cost of
20	the medication.

22	SUMMARY
24	This bill extends income eligibility for the elderly
	low-cost drug program by allowing persons whose income exceeds
26	the limits by up to 30% and 40% to pay copayments of 30% and 40%,
	respectively.
