determined at this time. Public Law 1999, chapter 16, the 2 "2000-2001 current services" budget, includes General Fund appropriations of approximately \$77,250 and \$79,500 in fiscal 4 years 1999-00 and 2000-01, respectively, for these tuition costs.

6 The University of Maine System, Maine Technical College System and Maine Maritime Academy will incur some minor 8 additional costs to waive 50% of the tuition costs for these students. These costs can be absorbed within the postsecondary 10 education institutions' existing budgeted resources.'

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## SUMMARY

This amendment provides that a high school student must be enrolled in grade 11 or 12 to qualify for the eligibility exception for receipt of a state subsidy for postsecondary courses provided in the bill. The amendment also clarifies that to qualify for the eligibility exception a student must be assessed and recommended by the administration of the student's school. Finally, the amendment adds a fiscal note to the bill.
