of games of chance offered by nonprofit organizations. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

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SUMMARY

The bill removes the restriction in current law regarding the number of licensed games of chance that may be operated by nonprofit organizations. This amendment restores the restrictive language. It further amends the bill by changing current law, which allows nonprofit organizations to conduct games of chance once every 6 months for a maximum of 3 consecutive days, to allow for games to be conducted once every 3 months for 2 consecutive days.

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
