This Act takes effect 26 October 1, 1999, except for section 11, which is retroactive to September 1, 1999. 28 30 SUMMARY 32 This bill provides a new membership structure for the Maine 34 HIV Advisory Committee. It decreases the membership from 36 to 21 and provides for membership selection through a new membership 36 committee. This bill provides an effective date of October 1, 1999. 38
