36	SUMMARY

This bill includes quality child care as an integral part of the overall statewide goals and objectives for child abuse prevention activities of the Maine Children's Trust Incorporated. This bill expands the definition of prevention programs to include the promotion of high-quality child care and it requires that the names of both the successful and unsuccessful applicants for the trust's grants be submitted to the Legislature.
