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SENATE AMENDMENT "A " to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 391, L.D. 1170, Bill, "An Act Concerning the Review of State Solid Waste Management Policies"

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Amend the amendment by striking out all of the 3rd indented paragraph after the title (page 1, lines 30 to 40 in amendment) and inserting in its place the following:

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'In conjunction with revisions of the plan as determined appropriate by the office, but no less often than once every 5 years, the office shall establish a broad-based task force, including Legislators from the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resource matters and representatives of groups interested in commercial-landfill solid waste management policy. During the course of its study, the task force shall consult with members of the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resources matters.'

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Further amend the amendment on page 2 by striking out all of the first indented paragraph (page 2, lines 1 and 2 in amendment)

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Further amend the amendment by striking out all of section 2.

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FISCAL NOTE

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This amendment reduces the General Fund cost of the bill by \$3,675 in fiscal year 1999-00 as a result of removing the language that requires legislative membership on the task force.

2 The task force is currently required to report its findings
4 and recommendations to the joint standing committee of the
6 Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resource matters.
8 The Legislature will incur some additional costs if the task
 force consults with members of that committee. These costs can
 be absorbed within the Legislature's existing budgeted resources.

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SUMMARY

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 This amendment removes language that requires that
14 membership on the solid waste management task force include
16 Legislators from the joint standing committee of the Legislature
18 having jurisdiction over natural resources matters. It requires
 the task force to consult with members of the joint standing
 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural
 resources matters.
