SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 391, L.D. 1170

The task force is currently required to report its findings and recommendations to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resource matters. The Legislature will incur some additional costs if the task force consults with members of that committee. These costs can be absorbed within the Legislature's existing budgeted resources.

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SUMMARY

This amendment removes language that requires that membership on the solid waste management task force include Legislators from the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resources matters. It requires the task force to consult with members of the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over natural resources matters.
