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Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2357, sub-§2, ¶D, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read:

D. On the tri-axle unit of a 4-axle single-unit vehicle hauling-ferest-preducts, 64,000 pounds.

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SUMMARY

12 This bill amends the weight tolerance for certain trucks by allowing a maximum load of 64,000 pounds on the tri-axle unit of 14 a 4-axle single-unit vehicle that carries certain materials. These materials include building materials that absorb moisture 16 during delivery originating and terminating within the State, bark, sawdust, firewood, sawed lumber, dimension lumber, pulpwood, wood chips, logs, soil, unconsolidated rock material 18 including limestone, bolts, farm produce, road 20 manufacturer's concrete products, solid waste or incinerator ash, highway construction materials, products requiring refrigeration 22 and raw ore when transported from a mine or quarry to a place of processing. Under current law, the tolerance applies only to the 24 tri-axle unit of a 4-axle single-unit vehicle that carries forest products.
