An Act to Amend the Qualifications of Weighmasters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 10 MRSA §2501, as amended by PL 1997, c. 454, §6, is 4 repealed and the following enacted in its place:

6 §2501. Qualifications

8 1. Individual license. A person wishing to be a licensed public weighmaster shall make application to the state sealer upon forms provided by the state sealer, and each application 10 must be accompanied by a fee of \$25. When the state sealer 12 receives an application and is satisfied that the applicant is of good moral character, has the ability to weigh accurately and to 14 make correct weight certificates, has passed such oral or written examination as the state sealer may require and makes an oath to execute the requisite duties satisfactorily, the state sealer 16 shall grant the applicant a license as a public weighmaster. A 18 license expires on December 31st annually or in a manner consistent with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, whichever is later, unless sooner revoked or suspended under section 2506. 20 A licensed public weighmaster shall, at the public weighmaster's own expense, procure an impression seal. The public weighmaster's 22 name and the word "Maine" must be inscribed around the outer margin of the seal and the words "licensed public weighmaster" 24 must appear in the center of the seal. The seal must be impressed 26 upon each weight certificate issued by the licensed public weighmaster.

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2. Corporate license. A business, company or corporation 30 wishing to be a licensed public weighmaster shall make application to the state sealer upon forms provided by the state 32 sealer, and each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$250. When the state sealer receives an application and is 34 satisfied that the business, company or corporation has the ability to train its employees to weigh accurately and to make 36 correct weight certificates, the employees passed such oral or written examination as the state sealer may require and the 38 employees make an oath to execute the requisite duties satisfactorily, the state sealer shall grant the business, 40 company or corporation a license as a public weighmaster, A license expires on December 31st annually or in a manner 42 consistent with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, whichever is later, unless sooner revoked or suspended under section 2506. 44 A licensed public weighmaster shall, at the public weighmaster's own expense, procure an impression seal. The business, company 46 or corporation name and the word "Maine" must be inscribed around the outer margin of the seal and the words "licensed public weighmaster" must appear in the center of the seal. The seal 48 must be impressed upon each weight certificate issued by the 50 licensed public weighmaster. All employees of the business, company or corporation are deemed to be operating under the
