## 10 SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill. This amendment also replaces the title to more accurately reflect the bill as amended and changes the bill to a resolve. The amendment directs the Public Utilities Commission to undertake an examination of single-exchange, flat-rate, basic service calling areas and to develop proposals for expanding those areas. The commission must report its findings and proposals to the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities and Energy by January 1, 2000. The amendment authorizes the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities and Energy to report out legislation concerning basic service calling areas to the Second Regular Session of the 119th Legislature. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
