An Act to Amend the Fishing Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7001, sub-§11, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 420, 4 \$1, is amended to read: "Fly" means a single pointed hook dressed with Fly. 6 11. feathers, hair, thread, tinsel, or any similar material to which no additional weights, hook, spinner, spoon or similar device is 8 added. 10 Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §7001, sub-§12, as amended by PL 1985, c. 369, 12 §1, is further amended to read: Fly fishing. "Fly fishing" means casting upon water 14 12. and retrieving in the-usual-and-erdinary a manner net in which the weight of the line casts the fly. No more than 3 unbaited 16 artificial flies individually attached to a line to-which no extra-weight-has-been-added may be used. 18 Sec. 3. 12 MRSA §7001, sub-§33-D, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 20 443, $\S4$, is amended to read: 22 33-D. 48	This bill includes the fishing recommendations of the Rules
	Commission of the Sportsman's Alliance of Maine.

2 The bill redefines the terms "single-baited hook," "fly" and "fly fishing." It also clarifies that the prohibition on 4 trolling applies only to persons fishing from mechanically powered boats, clarifies that one-day and 3-day fishing licenses 6 are valid for the hours specified on the license, amends the laws regarding fishing with illegal implements and repeals the laws 8 pertaining to the illegal use of helicopters.
