	1. Compensation for interference with use and enjoyment. A
8	person who owns property abutting a solid or special waste
	landfill and who owned the property prior to the establishment of
10	the landfill is entitled to receive 5% of the tipping fees or
	other revenue received by the landfill licensee or the State as
12	compensation for the landfill's interference with use and
	enjoyment of the abutter's property.

	2. Water testing. A person who owns property abutting a
16	solid or special waste landfill is entitled to have a semiannual
	independent water test paid for by the licensee or the State.

	3. Payments. Payments required in this section must be
20	made from tipping fees and other revenues of the facility.

	SUMMARY

	This bill provides that persons who owned property abutting
26	a landfill prior to the development of the landfill are entitled
	to receive 5% of the tipping fees as compensation for
28	interference with the use and enjoyment of the property. They
20	are also entitled to have the licensee of the landfill or the
30	State nav for semiannual water testing.
