COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "*A*" to H.P. 868, L.D. 1225, "Resolve,
to Direct the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to
Review Rules for Compliance with the Americans With Disabilities
Act"

24 Amend the resolve by striking out all of section 1 and
26 inserting in its place the following:

28 '**Sec. 1. Report. Resolved:** That no later than January 1, 2001,
the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife shall submit a
30 report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having
jurisdiction over inland fisheries and wildlife matters on the
32 following items:

34 1. The type and number of unconventional or special
privilege licenses currently authorized for issuance by the
36 Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife for any type of
disability, including a temporary disability;

38 2. Criteria and standards used by the department to
40 determine eligibility for such licenses;

42 3. Guidelines for establishing reciprocity with other
states on such licenses;

44 4. Recommendations for improving the promotion of hunting
46 and fishing opportunities in the State to the disabled community;

48 5. Recommendations on the use of special or group hunts or
special seasons for the disabled and on allowing another person
to assist a disabled person to hunt or fish; and

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 868, L.D. 1225

2 The amendment also authorizes the Joint Standing Committee
on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to report out a bill on the
4 issue of expanding hunting and fishing opportunities for persons
with a disability to the First Regular Session of the 120th
6 Legislature.

The amendment adds a fiscal note to the bill.
