- 1. It requires the Commissioner of Education to adopt or amend rules for the administration of medication to students in public or approved private schools. These rules must follow the training model and use the training manual developed by the School Health Advisory Committee.
- 2. It requires public or approved private schools to develop written local policies and procedures for administering medication by the start of the 2001-02 school year; local policies must include a requirement that all unlicensed personnel who administer medications receive training before they are authorized to do so.
- 3. It provides that these requirements be added to the standards for basic school approval. These state rules and local policies and procedures must be developed and implemented for the start of the 2001-02 school year.
 - 4. It adds a fiscal note to the bill.
