COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 913, L.D. 1291, Bill, "An Act to Amend the Liquor Licensing Laws Regarding Bed and Breakfasts"

Amend the bill by striking out all of section 1.

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 2 the following:

'Sec. 3. 28-A MRSA §1051, sub-§3, ¶A, as amended by PL 1997, c. 501, §3, is further amended to read:

A. Subject to law and the rules of the bureau, hotel or bed and breakfast licensees may sell liquor in the original packages or by the drink to bona fide registered room guests. Any sale to a guest may be delivered to the guest's room only by a hotel or bed and breakfast employee.'

Further amend the bill by relettering or renumbering any nonconsecutive Part letter or section number to read consecutively.

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

Allowing bed and breakfasts to obtain certain licenses will result in insignificant increases of General Fund revenue from license fees.'

This amendment removes the provision of the bill allowing a bed and breakfast to acquire a Class I liquor license. It also allows a bed and breakfast licensee to deliver alcohol to a room in the bed and breakfast under certain conditions. The amendment also adds a fiscal note.
