## An Act to Amend the Liquor Licensing Laws Regarding Bed and Breakfasts.

Bed and breakfasts; б Sec. 2. 28-A MRSA §1012, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1987, c. 623,  $\S13$ , is further amended to read: 8 10 Off-premise catering license. A Class A restaurant, 3. hotel, bed and breakfast or club licensed to sell spirits, wine and malt liquor may obtain a license to conduct off-premise 12 catering of spirits, wine and malt liquor as provided in section 1052. 14 The license fee per calendar day of the event or 16 Α. gathering is .....\$10. 18 Sec. 3. 28-A MRSA §1052, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1993, c. 730,  $\S40$ , is further amended to read: 20 22 1. Off-premise catering license for sale of liquor off-premise. Class A restaurants, Class A lounges, Class A restaurant/lounges, hotels, bed and breakfasts and clubs licensed 24 to sell spirits, wine and malt liquor may apply for an additional 26 license to conduct off-premises catering of spirits, wine and malt liquor at planned events or gatherings to be held at locations other than the licensee's premises under this section. 28 Sec. 4. 28-A MRSA §1061-A, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 30 730,  $\S41$ , is repealed. 32 **SUMMARY** 34 36 This bill amends the licensing requirements for bed and breakfasts to: 38 1. Allow a bed and breakfast to obtain a Class I liquor 40 license; 42 Allow a bed and breakfast to obtain an off-premise 2. catering license; and 44 3. Remove the restriction that a bed and breakfast may only 46 serve liquor to bona fide registered patrons and the patron's quests.
