30	rates for consumer-directed personal care attendants. These new rules must provide for increasing the reimbursement rates by
40	\$1.75 per hour for work performed during the day under regular
40	Medicaid or the Medicaid waiver program and by \$10 per night
42	under the regular Medicaid program as a night attendant or by \$11
42	per night under the Medicaid waiver program as a night
44	attendant. In the home-based care program the reimbursement
77	rates must increase by \$2 per hour for work performed during the

40	day and by \$8 per night as a night attendant. Rules adopted
48	pursuant to this Act are routine technical rules as defined in
40	the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.

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SUMMARY

This bill requires the Department of Human Services to adopt rules by October 1, 1999 to increase the reimbursement rates of consumer-directed personal care attendants. The bill also enacts a mechanism to ensure a review of the reimbursement rates every 2 years and requires input from consumers and the Long-term Care Steering Committee as part of the review process.

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
