Resolve, to Create a Commission to Study the Hearing Process of the Workers' Compensation Board.

(EMERGENCY)

Whereas,** Acts and resolves of the 2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, there are concerns about the time frames 6 established in current law for the hearing procedures of the Workers' Compensation Board; and

Whereas, these time-frame concerns raise questions about fairness to the parties addressing a workers' compensation claim; and

Whereas, these questions must be examined as soon as 14 possible to remedy any current unfairness in the timing of the workers' compensation hearing process; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the Hearing Process of the Workers' Compensation Board, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of 6 members appointed as follows:

One representative of the Department of Labor appointed
 jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the
 House, who shall consider recommendations from the Commissioner
 of Labor in making the appointment;

36 2. One member of the Joint Standing Committee on Banking
 and Insurance appointed jointly by the President of the Senate
 and the Speaker of the House;

3. Three members of the Joint Standing Committee on Labor,
 with one Senator appointed by the President of the Senate and 2
 Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House; and

44 4. One representative of an insurance company appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the
 46 House; and be it further

48 Sec. 3. Appointments; convening; chair. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 10 days following the 50 effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council upon
making their appointments. When the appointment of all members is complete, the Executive Director of the Legislative Council
shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission. The commission shall select a chair from among its members at the
first meeting; and be it further

8 Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study the time frames in current law and practice of the Workers' 10 Compensation Board hearing process and related procedures; and be it further

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Sec. 5. Recommendations. Resolved: That the commission shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations with accompanying legislation, if any, to the First Regular Session of the 119th Legislature and to the Joint Standing Committee on Labor by April 30, 1999; and be it further

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission shall request staffing and clerical assistance from the Legislative Council; and be it further

Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem for each day's attendance at meetings of the commission. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall administer compensation requests.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the 30 preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

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SUMMARY

This resolve creates the Commission to Study the Hearing Process of the Workers' Compensation Board. The commission is to report, with any accompanying legislation, to the Legislature and the Joint Standing Committee on Labor by April 30, 1999.
