	This bill requires the Department of Human Services to allow
22	an individual caretaker that is not the parent of a child and is
	eligible for TANF benefits for assuming responsibility for a
24	child to receive the same amount of assistance as the department
26	would provide a custodial parent. A caretaker is an individual
26	that has or assumes responsibility for the care of a child.
