2	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2521, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1993, c.
4	683, Pt. A, §2 and affected by Pt. B, §5, is amended to read:
6	2. Type of test. A law enforcement officer shall administer a breath test unless, in that officer's determination,
8	a breath test is unreasonable.
10	The law enforcement officer may determine which type of breath test is to be administered.
12	
	Another chemical test must be administered in place of a breath
14	test.
16	For a blood test the operator may choose a physician, emergency medical technician or other person trained to draw blood, is
18	reasonably available.
