2 **Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved:** That the Commission
to Study the Future Use and Reclamation of Number One Pond in
Sanford is established; and be it further

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6 **Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved:** That the commission consists of
11 members appointed as follows: Seven members of the Joint
Standing Committee on Natural Resources, 5 of whom are members of
8 the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the
House and 2 of whom are members of the Senate appointed by the
10 President of the Senate; one person appointed by the Governor;
and 3 persons appointed by the municipal officers of Sanford; and
12 be it further

14 **Sec. 3. Appointments. Resolved:** That all appointments must be
made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this
16 resolve. The appointing authorities shall notify the Executive
Director of the Legislative Council upon making their
18 appointments. When the appointment of all members is complete,
the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the
20 first meeting of the commission no later than October 1, 1999.
The commission shall select a chair from among its legislative
22 members; and be it further

24 **Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved:** That the commission shall study the
environmental quality of Number One Pond in Sanford, the
26 condition of public areas adjacent to the pond and possible
future uses of the pond and adjacent public areas and shall
28 recommend steps necessary to clean up and restore the environment
of the lake and adjacent public areas. In examining these
30 issues, the commission shall meet when and where determined
necessary by the commission; and be it further

32 **Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved:** That the commission shall
34 request staffing and clerical assistance from the Legislative
Council; and be it further

36 **Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved:** That the commission members
38 who are Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per
diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section
40 2, for each day's attendance at meetings of the commission. All
members of the commission are entitled to reimbursement for
42 travel and other necessary expenses, upon application to the
Legislative Council. The Executive Director of the Legislative
44 Council shall administer the commission's budget; and be it
further

46 **Sec. 7. Report. Resolved:** That the commission shall submit
48 its report with any accompanying legislation to the Second
Regular Session of the 119th Legislature by December 1, 1999.

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SUMMARY

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This resolve establishes an 11-member commission to study the environmental condition of Number One Pond in Sanford and adjacent public areas and to recommend steps necessary to clean up and restore the environment of the pond and surrounding lands. The commission is to report to the Second Regular Session of the 119th Legislature by December 1, 1999.

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
