## An Act to Restore Funding for Continuing Education for Teachers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §12504, as amended by PL 1997, c. 24, Pt. G,  $\S1$ , is further amended to read: 4 §12504. Allocation of funds 6 The chief executive officer shall establish by rule the 8 allocation of funds available under this chapter. 10 Loans of up to \$1,500 per academic year or \$6,000 total may 12 be made to eligible teachers engaged in graduate study or continuing education and students pursuing postbaccalaureate teacher certification. Loans of up to \$3,000 per academic year 14 or \$12,000 total may be made to eligible graduating high school seniors and college students. An individual who has received a 16 Teachers for Maine loan or a Blaine House Scholars Program loan a graduating high school senior or as a college student may 18 as also receive a loan for students pursuing postbaccalaureate teacher certification or as a teacher engaged in graduate 20 education or continuing education. In no event may an individual receive more than \$18,000 in total. Loans for undergraduate 22 students and postbaccalaureate recipients are for one academic 24 year and are automatically renewed if the recipient maintains a grade point average of 2.5 based on a 4.0 grade point system or the equivalent. Loans for teachers are automatically renewable 26 only if the applicant is pursuing a continuing course of study 28 approved at the time of the initial application. 30 An eligible individual who has received a loan as a student pursuing postbaccalaureate teacher certification may subsequently receive a loan as a teacher engaged in graduate study or 32 continuing education, including undergraduate courses. In no event may an individual receive Teachers for Maine loans or 34 Blaine House Scholars Program loans totaling more than \$6,000. 36 Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §12508, first ¶, as amended by PL 1997, c. 24, Pt. G,  $\S2$ , is further amended to read: 38 40 Each recipient of a loan designated for teachers pursuing graduate study or continuing education or for students pursuing 42 postbaccalaureate teacher certification may cancel the total amount of the loan by completing one year of return service for each year a loan is received in the public schools or private 44 schools approved for tuition purposes in the State. The return 46 service requirement is one year of return service for 2 loans received if return service is performed in underserved subject areas or in teacher shortage areas. 48 Return service for this purpose must be performed within 3 years of graduation from the 50 institution of higher education or completion of the course or

courses for which the funds were given. In no event may return 2 service be credited for the same semester for which an individual receives a loan pursuant to this chapter. An individual receiving loan forgiveness for a loan for a teacher pursuing 4 graduate study or continuing education or a postbaccalaureate teacher certification loan may not receive loan forgiveness for 6 any undergraduate loan simultaneously. If the chief executive officer grants a deferment, the time period for performance of 8 return service may be extended for the same period as the 10 Failure to fulfill the return service option will deferment. necessitate repayment to the authority as follows. 12

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#### **SUMMARY**

Public Law 1997, chapter 24, Part G eliminated provisions that allowed teachers pursuing graduate study or continuing education to receive loans from the Teachers for Maine Program. This bill reauthorizes those types of loans and restores funding for the program at levels previously available.
