preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

This bill creates 2 full-time positions at the Public Utilities Commission for the purpose of monitoring and participating in the New England power pool committee process and in proceedings before the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to protect the interests of ratepayers in the State in the restructuring of the New England power pool. The 2 positions are assigned exclusively to these tasks to ensure adequate, timely and informed state participation in the New England power pool and Federal Energy Regulatory Commission process.
