

The transfer of the responsibility for administering the regulation of arborists to the Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources will increase dedicated revenue collected by the department from application, examination and licensing fees by \$26,350 and \$28,950 in fiscal years 1999-00 and 2000-01, respectively. The bill includes Other Special Revenue funds allocations for the department of \$16,845 and \$22,995 in fiscal years 1999-00 and 2000-01, respectively, for the costs of administering the regulation of arborists.'
