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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " $\mathcal{A}$ " to S.P. 486, L.D. 1446

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Commission created. Resolved: That the Business Advisory Commission on Quality Child Care Financing, referred to in this resolve as the "commission," is created to examine the important issues of public policy regarding strategies to secure adequate financing of child care facilities and services in order to promote economic growth and the general welfare of the people of this State; and be it further

Sec. 2. Members. Resolved: That the commission consists of 16 12 members appointed as follows:

 18 1. Two members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, at least one of whom is a member of the minority
20 party;

22 2. Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House, at least one of whom is a member of the 24 minority party;

26 3. The Commissioner of Economic and Community Development, or the commissioner's designee;

The State Tax Assessor, or the State Tax Assessor's
designee;

32 5. Five members of the public, representing business, education and child care interests, appointed as follows: one and one 34 member representing business member representing education, appointed by the President of the Senate; one member 36 representing child care and one member representing business, appointed by the Speaker of the House; and one member representing business, appointed by the Governor; and 38

40 6. A representative from the child care licensing division of the Department of Human Services; and be it further

Sec. 3. Appointments; first meeting. Resolved: That appointments of the first members of the commission must be made no later than days after the effective date of this section. The Commissioner of Economic and Community Development or the commissioner's designee shall convene the first meeting of the commission no later than 60 days after the effective date of this section; and be it further

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Sec. 4. Quorum. Resolved: That a quorum of the commission is 7 members, and the affirmative vote of at least 7 members of the commission is necessary to conduct business; and be it further

Sec. 5. Duties. Resolved: That the commission has the following duties:

8 1. Gathering information pertaining to quality child care and early education, the financing of quality child care and 10 early education and economic development incentives available to encourage the development of quality child care and early 12 education facilities and services; and

 Analyzing the effectiveness of economic development incentives available to encourage the development of quality
child care and early education facilities and services in this State and in other states and countries; and be it further

Sec. 6. Staffing. Resolved: That the Department of Economic and Community Development shall provide staff assistance to the commission; and be it further

Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit 24 its report no later than December 1, 2000 to the Commissioner of Economic Community Development, the Commissioner of and 26 Education, the Commissioner of Human Services, the Joint Standing Committee on Business and Economic Development, the Joint 28 Standing Committee on Education and Cultural Affairs and the Joint Standing Committee on Health and Human Services including 30 the findings and recommendations of the commission and any proposed legislation regarding the development of quality child 32 care facilities and services and economic development incentives to encourage the development of quality child care facilities and 34 services; and be it further

36 Sec. 8. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of 38 this resolve.

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#### **SUMMARY**

This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve. This amendment changes the annual reporting date of the Business Advisory Commission on Quality Child Care Financing to a one-time reporting date of December 1, 2000. The amendment deletes reference to terms of commission members. The amendment also adds a representative from the child care licensing division of the Department of Human Services to the commission. The amendment also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the bill.

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
