

Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7463-A, sub-§6, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1997, c.
4 24, Pt. I, §3, is amended to read:

(1) Five dollars for a one-chance application;

(2) Ten dollars for a 3-chance application, ~~---A resident must possess a valid big game hunting license to be eligible to purchase a 3-chance application;~~ and

This bill eliminates the requirement that residents have a
22 valid big game hunting license to purchase a 3- or 6-chance
application for the moose license lottery.
