2	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
4	<pre>Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7102-A, sub-§6, ¶C, as corrected by RR 1993, c. 1, §35, is amended to read:</pre>
6	C. The commissioner shall by rule establish a special archery season beginning at least 30 days prior <u>to</u> and
8	extending to the beginning of the regular deer hunting season, as described in section 7457, subsection 1,
10	paragraph A, for the purpose of hunting deer with bow and arrow only. During the special archery season on deer, the
12	following restrictions apply.
14	(1) Deer may be taken only by means of a hand-held bow and broadhead arrow, provided that:
16	(a) Bows must be of adequate strength to shoot an
18	arrow at least 150 yards; and
20	(b) Arrowheads must be at least 7/8 inch in width.
22	(2) A person may not carry firearms of any kind while hunting any species of wildlife with bow and arrow
24	during the special archery season on deer, except that any person who holds a license that allows hunting with
26	firearms may carry a handgun.

	SUMMARY
28	
20	This bill allows a person who has killed a deer during the
30	special archery season for deer to hunt and kill a 2nd deer with a firearm during the regular firearm season for deer. The bill
32	also repeals the regulation of the taking of antlerless deer and
	permits hunters to take any deer. The bill requires the
34	Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife to report to the
	Joint Standing Committee on Inland Fisheries and Wildlife at the

end of the hunting season for the years 1999 and 2000 on the results of having an open deer hunting season as opposed to a

restricted hunting season. The bill also increases the moose

hunting permits from 2,000 to 3,000.
