	§1391. Definitions
10	As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
12	indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
14	1. Closed nuclear power plant. "Closed nuclear power
16	plant" means a nuclear fission thermal power plant that has ceased to generate electricity and is permanently retired from active service.
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20	2. Decommissioning materials. "Decommissioning materials" means any materials, whether solid or fluid, removed from a closed nuclear power plant, other than licensed discharges from
22	the plant.
24	3. Dispose of. "Dispose of" means to deposit or attempt to
26	deposit in the land or waters of this State.
28	§1392. Prohibition
30	A person may not dispose of decommissioning materials without a permit issued by the department pursuant to this
32	chapter.
34	§1393. Permit: fee: rules
36	An application for a permit to dispose of decommissioning
38	materials must be on a form designated by the department. The application must specify the materials that the applicant seeks
40	to dispose of and the location where the applicant proposes to dispose of these materials. When an application for a permit
42	under this section is received by the department, the department shall notify the municipality in which the proposed disposal site
44	is located. A permit may not be issued for the disposal of decommissioning materials if the department determines that the materials pose a threat to the public health, safety or welfare.

	The department may adopt rules implementing this section
48	that establish standards consistent with this section for the
50	issuance of permits and that establish a fee for the processing
30	of permit applications. Any fee established by rule must be sufficient to recover all costs of administering, monitoring
52	compliance with and enforcing the provisions of this chapter.

Fees collected pursuant to this section must be deposited in the Maine Environmental Protection Fund. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II-A.

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## **SUMMARY**

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This bill establishes a permit requirement for disposal in this State of decommissioning materials from a nuclear power plant. The bill also requires notice to any municipality in which decommissioning materials are proposed to be disposed of.
