2	school in which at least 30% of the students enrolled on October
4	1, 1998 were eligible for free or reduced-price meals qualifies for a one-time support grant of up to \$3,000 toward the cost of
4	establishing a school breakfast program.

8	1. A school qualifying for a grant that chooses not to establish a school breakfast program shall file a report with the Department of Education explaining why it chose not to offer a

12	2. Nothing in this section prevents a school not qualifying for a grant from implementing a school breakfast program at any
