36	Sec. 2. Membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of

40	1. Three members from the Senate, appointed by the

44	Committee on Business and Economic Development and the Joint Standing Committee on Taxation; and

Sec. 3. Chairs. Resolved: That the first Senate member named is the Senate chair and the first House member named is the House chair; and be it further

Sec. 4. Appointments; meetings. Resolved: 6 That all initial appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The appointing authorities shall 8 notify the Executive Director of the Legislative Council upon 10 making their appointments. The chairs of the commission shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission no later 12 than 45 days following the effective date of this resolve. The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of 14 Representatives shall reappoint members or appoint new members from the 120th Legislature to serve on the commission by February 16 15, 2001. The commission may hold up to 8 meetings; and be it further

Sec. 5. Responsibilities. Resolved: That the responsibilities of the commission include the following:

22 1. To develop criteria for defining a company or business as an environmental leader;

 To develop incentives to encourage companies and
businesses to become environmental leaders and to attract environmental leaders to the State; and

3. To identify opportunities for and obstacles to creating 30 an environmental leadership program; and be it further

32 Sec. 6. Working groups. Resolved: That the commission shall form advisory working groups from among affected agencies, 34 representatives of the business community, representatives of environmental groups, organizations devoted to economic growth 36 and the public to help carry out its responsibilities; and be it further 38

Sec. 7. Compensation. Resolved: That members of the commission are entitled to receive the legislative per diem and reimbursement of necessary expenses for their attendance at authorized meetings of the commission. Participants in the advisory working groups serve without compensation; and be it further

46 Sec. 8. Staff assistance. Resolved: That upon approval of the Legislative Council, the Office of Policy and Legal Analysis
48 shall provide necessary staffing services to the commission; and be it further

Sec. 9. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit a report and any implementing legislation by January 15, 2002 to 2 the joint standing committees of the Legislature represented on 4 the commission. If the commission requires a limited extension of time to conclude its study and make its report, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension. 6 The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction 8 over natural resources matters may report out a bill regarding an environmental leadership program to the Second Regular Session of 10 the 120th Legislature; and be it further

12 Sec. 10. Commission budget. Resolved: That the chairs of the commission, with assistance from the commission staff, shall administer the commission's budget. Within 10 days after its first meeting, the commission shall present a work plan and proposed budget to the Legislative Council for approval. The commission may not incur expenses that would result in the 18 commission exceeding its approved budget; and be it further

20 Sec. 11. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.

6 This resolve includes a General Fund appropriation of \$7,220 in fiscal year 2000-01 for the Legislature for the per diem and 8 expenses of legislative members of the Commission to Study the Establishment of an Environmental Leadership Program and to print 10 the required report.

12 The additional costs associated with providing staffing assistance to the commission during the interim between legislative sessions can be absorbed by the Legislature utilizing 14 existing budgeted resources. If the commission requires staffing 16 assistance during the legislative session, the Legislature may require an additional General Fund appropriation to contract for 18 staff services.

20 State departments and agencies will incur some minor additional costs if requested to serve on working groups formed 22 by the commission. These costs can be absorbed within the existing budgeted resources of the affected state agencies.'

SUMMARY

28 This amendment replaces the bill with a resolve and changes the title. The amendment establishes the Commission to Study the 30 Establishment of an Environmental Leadership Program, composed of 8 legislative members. The duties of the commission are to 32 develop criteria for defining a company or business as an environmental leader, to develop incentives to encourage 34 companies and businesses to become environmental leaders, to attract environmental leaders to the State and to identify 36 opportunities for and obstacles to creating an environmental leadership program. The amendment requires the commission to 38 submit a report to the Legislature by January 15, 2002 and gives authority to the joint standing committee of the Legislature 40 having jurisdiction over natural resources matters to report out a bill to the Second Regular Session of the 120th Legislature. 42 The amendment also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the bill.

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
