For purposes of this section, a person is presumed to be a resident of the State if that person has:

1. Enrolled child in public school. Enrolled a minor child of whom that person has sole or primary custody in a public school within the State; or

2. Declared or indicated primary residence in State.

Declared, indicated or stated that that person's primary residence is in the State on any form, document or application used by public and private entities or persons.

An oral statement by a person stating a Maine address as that person's primary residence is prima facie evidence of primary residence under this section.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the summary the following:

#### FISCAL NOTE

Certain changes in the residency requirements for motor vehicle registration will result in insignificant increases of Highway Fund revenue from registration fees collected by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles within the Department of the Secretary of State. The additional enforcement costs can be absorbed by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles utilizing existing budgeted resources.

This bill may increase prosecutions for Class E crimes. If a jail sentence is imposed, the additional costs to the counties are estimated to be \$83.36 per day per prisoner. The number of prosecutions that may result in a jail sentence and the resulting costs to the county jail system are expected to be insignificant.

The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenue by minor amounts.'
