This bill includes an Other Special Revenue funds allocation of \$1,000 in fiscal year 1999-00 for the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation, Office of Licensing and Registration, for the cost of revising rules on behalf of the Board of Complementary Health Care Providers.'

#### SUMMARY

28 This amendment is the minority report. It replaces the entire text of the original bill. The amendment repeals the 30 language that allowed naturopathic doctors to prescribe "noncontrolled legend" substances. Under this amendment, naturopathic doctors would only be allowed to recommend or 32 prescribe nonprescription drugs, food, food extracts, homeopathic 34 remedies, vitamins, minerals, enzymes, digestive botanical substances. Naturopathic doctors would be prevented 36 from prescribing anything that requires a prescription under state or federal laws. As a result, the provision that would 38 have required collaborative practice with an allopathic or osteopathic physician for a 12-month period prior to being given 40 limited prescriptive authority is not necessary and is repealed by this amendment.

This amendment also clarifies that the law is not intended to prevent the practice of natural health consultation or natural health practice modalities by people other than those licensed to practice naturopathic medicine.

The amendment also adds an allocation and a fiscal note to the bill.
