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This resolve includes a General Fund appropriation of \$31,700 in fiscal year 2000-01 for the Legislature for the per diem and expenses of legislative members of the Committee to Develop a Compensation Program for Victims of Abuse at the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf, for costs related to consulting with compensation program experts, for public hearing costs and to print the required report.

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The additional costs associated with providing staffing assistance to the committee during the interim between legislative sessions can be absorbed by the Legislature utilizing existing budgeted resources. If an extension of the reporting deadline is granted and the committee requires assistance during the legislative session, the Legislature may require an additional General Fund appropriation to contract for staff services.

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The additional costs associated with reporting on the multiagency efforts can be absorbed by the Department of Education, the Department of Labor, the Department of Human Services and the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services utilizing existing budgeted resources.'

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#### **SUMMARY**

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This amendment replaces the original resolve.

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This amendment requires reports from the Department of Education, the Department of Labor, the Department of Human Services and the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services concerning their multiagency efforts to address the response to abuse of students at the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf and the provision of services to the Deaf community. Reports are due by August 1, 2000 and January 31, 2001.

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This amendment also establishes a 5-member committee, made up of Legislators, to develop a compensation program for victims of abuse at the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf. It lists specific items that must be considered in the study process and elements that must be included in the program. It includes resources to make use of consultants and participants from other compensation programs.

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The study committee must report to the First Regular Session of the 120th Legislature by November 1, 2000 with any implementing legislation.

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The amendment also adds an appropriation section and a fiscal note to the resolve.

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
