	2. Qualifications. State board rules governing the
	qualifications for a provisional teacher certificate must require
	that a certificate may only be issued to an applicant who has
	demonstrated:
	A. A thorough knowledge of the central concepts, tools of
	inquiry and structures of the discipline or disciplines to
	be taught and the ability to create meaningful learning
	experiences for students;
	B. The ability to integrate the central concepts, tools of
	inquiry and structures of the discipline or disciplines to
	be taught:
	C. A knowledge of the diverse ways in which students learn
	and develop and the ability to provide learning
	opportunities that support students' intellectual, physical,
	emotional and social development:
	D. The ability to plan instruction based on knowledge of
	subject matter, students and curriculum goals;
	E. An understanding of and the ability to use a variety of
	instructional strategies and appropriate technologies;
	F. The ability to create and maintain a classroom
	environment that supports and encourages learning;
	G. The ability to support students' learning and well-being
	by involving students, students' families, school staff
	members and administrators and the local community in the
	members and administrators and the local community in the
	learning process:

I. An awareness of and commitment to the ethical and legal responsibilities of teachers; and

support the development of students;

J. A strong professional ethic and a desire to contribute to the teaching profession.

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SUMMARY

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This bill implements the recommendations of the Advisory Committee on Results-based Initial Certification of Teachers to replace the current course-based standards for provisional certification of beginning teachers with 10 performance-based standards in which competency must be demonstrated before issuance of the provisional certification.
