any	The Tobacco Settlement Dedicated Fund, referred to in this ion as the "fund," is established to receive all revenue from settlement of pending or potential legal action against acco manufacturers brought by the State.
purr	1. Uses. Revenue to the fund may be used only for the poses listed in this subsection:
	A. Smoking cessation public education, seminars, treatment clinics and costs;
	B. Expansion of the elderly low-cost drug program under section 254 to cover health care expenses for smoking-related illness and disease;
	C. Health care coverage for persons who are unable to afford coverage; and
	D. Payment of health care costs for persons who use tobacco products.
	2. Dedicated fund. The fund is a special, dedicated, lapsing fund and any interest generated by the fund is lited to the fund. The department shall administer the fund.
• • • •	3. Limitation. Expenditure of funds is limited to 3/4 of

health care coverage for persons who are unable to afford coverage. Expenditures from the fund are limited to 3/4 of the
annual revenue unless approved by a vote of 3/4 of the members of the Senate and the House.
