The commissioner may adopt or amend rules to ensure that: 10 (1) All adjustments received were utilized and actually expended for equivalent instruction programs 12 authorized pursuant to section 5001-A, subsection 3; and 14 (2) No municipality receives reimbursement for a student who attends school at public expense. 16 18 Rules adopted pursuant to this paragraph are routine technical rules pursuant to Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 20 II A. 22 SUMMARY 24 This bill allows school administrative units to receive an 26 adjustment in their state subsidy payment for enrollment decreases due to resident students enrolled in a private school 28 or through home instruction in an equivalent instruction program. Under this bill, school administrative units must be reimbursed for students residing in the unit who are 30

participating in approved equivalent instruction programs. School administrative units are required to keep accurate records of students residing in the unit who are participating in approved equivalent instruction programs and shall include these students in the annual count of students attending school in the district.
