28	G. A gift certificate, 3 years after December 31st of the

38	SUMMARY
40	This amendment replaces the new language proposed in the
42	original bill. Current law provides that the amount of a gift certificate abandoned is the amount the purchaser paid for the
44	gift certificate. This amendment provides that the amount abandoned is 60% of the face value of the gift certificate if the
46	issuer imposes neither a dormancy charge nor a period of limitation on the owner's right to redeem the certificate at 100%
48	of face value. If the issuer does not meet that criteria, the current language applies; that is, the amount abandoned is the purchase price paid for the certificate.

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
