_	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §2174 is enacted to read:
4	<u>§2174. Exemption for crabmeat not in interstate commerce</u>
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	A home-based crabmeat processor is exempt from the
8	provisions of any hazard analysis critical control point program
	administered by the department pursuant to the United States Food
10	and Drug Administration's seafood hazard analysis critical
12	control point regulations if all the crabmeat processed by that person is sold for consumption in this State. All such crabmeat
14	must be clearly labeled "Not for sale or consumption outside the
14	State of Maine."
16	Sec. 2. Reimbursement. The Commissioner of Agriculture, Food
	and Rural Resources shall reimburse each home-based crabmeat
18	processor for all fees paid by that processor to attend training
20	or education sessions on the United States Food and Drug Administration's seafood hazard analysis critical control point
20	regulations.
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26	SUMMARY
20	This bill exempts home-based crabmeat processors from any
28	critical control point identification program administered by the
	Department of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources pursuant to
30	the United States Food and Drug Administration's seafood hazard
	analysis critical control point regulations as long as all the
32	crabmeat processed by that person is sold for consumption in the
~ 4	State. The bill requires such crabmeat to be clearly labeled
34	"Not for sale or consumption outside the State of Maine."
36	The bill also requires the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food
	and Rural Resources to reimburse all home-based crabmeat
38	processors for fees paid to attend training and educational
	meetings on the United States Food and Drug Administration's
40	seafood hazard analysis critical control point regulations.
